PAPATOETOE PONY CLUB

- - - X

Papatoetoe Pony Club (PPC) was founded in 1949 and is a popular and well run club. In November 2006, we moved from Papatoetoe to our current grounds in Brookby. These grounds are home to both the Pony Club and Papatoetoe Adult Riding Club (PARC).

Situated on a picturesque 105 acres in the heart of Brookby, this premier Club offers many facilities including:

- 1x Ebb & Flow Surface Arena
- 1x Sand & Shell Mix Surface Arena
- 1x Sand & Shell Mix 20x60 Dressage Arena
- 1x Lunging Ring
- Cross Country course with jumps ranging from pre-introductory (50cm) to $3\star$
- Covered pens (with storage lockers for the grazers)
- A large modern Pavilion with toilet and kitchen facilities
- The old clubrooms with kitchen and toilet facilities as well as block-out blinds and movie projection equipment
- Beautiful grazing paddocks (these are for our grazers as well as our club owned sheep and cattle)
- A lengthy bridle trail including bridges and creek crossings

The Club provides fantastic riding facilities and rallies for its members and holds a variety of memorable events throughout the year attracting riders from Auckland and beyond.



RALLIES

- - - X

We run our rallies throughout the season on a mix of Wednesdays and Saturdays. We are lucky to have an awesome selection of great coaches who rotate throughout the season. You can expect to have between 3 and 5 coaches throughout the season. This year we do not have a minimum number of rallies you need to attend to remain a member. If you cannot ride, you are welcome to attend unmounted, or ask any of the committee if you have another way you would like to be involved in our rallies. For our competitions and representative teams there are some requirements in the sections later in this booklet.

NO SHOW FEE - There is a \$20 fee payable if a rider signs up for rally and does not attend or cancels within the last 24 hours before rally with no yet or medical certificate.

Wednesday Rally - 4.30pm Start Time or 5.30pm Start Time

Saturday Rally - 10am Start Time

Booking a rally - This season we are changing our method of rally sign up. Your Head Coach will share more information when available.

IN-HOUSE COMPETITIONS

---X

We have 6 in-house competitions each season. These competitions have trophies associated with them which are awarded at the end of season prize-giving. For these competitions riders are split by age group and there are trophies for each category and age group.

Any rider wishing to compete for club trophies must have completed 5 rallies (at least three of these on the nominated horse or pony) within the current season. Age category is based on riders age as of 1st September 2025.

Eventing:

Our eventing trophies are awarded for the highest placed pony club rider at our **February horse trial.** There are no age limits for the three classes where we have these trophies;

Kayleigh Hatherley 65 Eventing Trophy
- Awarded to the highest placed PPC
rider in the 65cm class.

Lynn Hatherley 80 Eventing Trophy - Awarded to the highest placed PPC rider in the 80cm class.

Dave Hatherley 95 Eventing Trophy – Awarded to the highest placed PPC rider in the 95cm class.



PRIZE-GIVING

Prize Giving is held at the end of each season and is when all of the trophies from our internal competitions are awarded. We also award any certificates achieved throughout the season and celebrate our representative team riders.

CERTIFICATES

- - - X

We aim to run two exam sessions per season where eligible riders are invited to sit their certificates. In order to be eligible to sit for certificates, riders must have a minimum of three signatures against each curriculum criteria in their record of learning card. One of the signatures must be in the 'ready to be examined' column, some riders may get more than 2 signatures in the record of learning column.

Leading up to exams there will be additional horse management and riding sessions to prepare riders, including a mock exam day.

There is a small cost for sitting exams depending on the level of certificate. C+ certificate and above riders are also required to sit a pre exam assessment 4 weeks prior

to the exam. This is done during a rally.

To be eligible to sit certificates riders must meet these attendance requirements;

D, D+, C - 5 Working Rallies (3 of which must be on the nominated horse).



C+ - 4 Working Rallies (2 of which must be on the nominated horse).

B and Up - 2 Working Rallies (1 of which must be on the nominated horse).

DATES FOR EXAMS THIS SEASON:

Available twice a year prior to Christmas and throughout the season.Placeholder dates 6 Dec 2025 (C/B Level). 6-11 April 2026 - All levelS

REPRESENTATIVE EVENTS - x

Entry Requirements for Team Divisions:

- 2 NQSs within 12 months **OR** 3 NQSs within 24 months
- NQS Minimum Standards:
 - o Dressage: at least 50%
 - Cross-Country: max 30 penalties & ≤90 secs over optimum time
 - Show Jumping: max 16 penalties
- Rally attendance is mandatory



ARENA BOOKINGS

- - - X

You can have lessons from any instructor in any of the arenas on the grounds. If you want to have exclusive use of a space so you are not interrupted by other riders, the arena closest to the pavilion has three spaces. Arena 1 is the 60x20 dressage space (with mirrors), and 2A and 2B are half each of the main space. The link to the booking system is on the pony club website. The cost for booking is \$5 per 45 minutes.

GATE TAGS

- - - X

All new members will be charged a refundable bond of \$35 for their gate tag. Lost or extra tags will be charged at \$35 each. Refund of bond on return of tag. Gate tags remain the property of Papatoetoe Pony Club. If you would like an additional gate tag please contact membership@papatoetoeponyclub.co.nz

GUEST PASSES

- - - X

Members are able to bring non members onto the club grounds to ride using our guest pass system. This has a cost of \$30 per guest, the form on the website under membership> Guest Pass, must be completed prior to the visit. Payment is required prior to your guest arriving. Members are responsible for their guest/s and must accompany them at all times while they are on the grounds.

HEALTH AND SAFETY (ACCIDENTS)

- - - X

Horse riding is a sport which has risks, and we try to minimize these wherever we can. We want to make sure that everyone on our grounds is safe. If you have an accident, or see something unsafe, it's up to you to report it. We have an online form on the club website for this.

If you have a fall, please don't be offended if you are asked to undertake a simple concussion test before you can remount. If there is any doubt about the safety of you continuing to ride, you'll be asked to stop riding.



GRAZING

- - - X

Grazing places are available on application for pony club and adult ride members.

We have available:

Herd Grazing \$170 per month (Mares & Gelding herds)

Segregated grazing \$300 per month

Float parking \$40 per month (available to all members)

Truck parking \$50 per month (available to all members)

WORKING BEE HOURS AND HOW THEY ARE RUN

- - - X

The season is from 1st September 2025- 31st August 2026. The required amount of hours per season is a minimum of 18 hours per family. We run a lot of large events and we need all the help available to do this. 18 in the minimum, but if you can offer more, even better!

Cost for not completing hours is \$1,000 PPC Competitions and organised working bees for maintenance around the club count towards your hours.

If you act as a first aider for a rally you can also count this as 1.5 hours.

RULES

- - - X

- Papatoetoe Pony Club shall abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Papatoetoe Pony Club Constitution.
- Grazers on Club grounds shall abide by the conditions of the Grazing Rules and the Grazing Agreement.
- 3. Supervision guidelines (below) must be adhered to at all times.
- 4. Approved helmets with a yellow tag are to be worn whilst riding at all times on Pony Club grounds.
- Bad language, excessive use of a whip or spurs will not be tolerated and will be dealt with immediately by the most senior person present at the time or referred to a Committee member.
- 6. You must not exceed the speed limit of 15km per hour when driving down the driveway or anywhere around the Club.
- 7. There is no lunging in arenas 1, 2, 3.
- 8. Jumps are not permitted in the lunging arena or dressage arena.
- When jumping cross-country you must wear an approved and tagged back protector.
- 10. All droppings must be picked up from the arenas, covered pens, driveways and outside yards and transferred to the designated manure pile (located at the back of the covered pens). Hay is not to be fed in the covered pens. Please use the outside grass pens if you need to feed hay. The covered pens must be swept after use to remove all debris and feed and when necessary washed if the horse has urinated to eliminate smells and reduce flies in the area.
- 11. Boots with heels must be worn in stirrups.
- 12. Horses must not be ridden in head collars/halters bridles only.
- 13. All dogs must be on a lead at all times and under control.
- 14. Horses must not be left unattended in the concrete pen area for long periods of time, On competition days horses must be put into the outside grass yards so they are not standing on the concrete yards for long periods of time.
- 15. Horses under four years' old, unbroken horses and stallions are not permitted on the grounds without written permission from the committee.
- Floats and trucks are to be stored in the designated "Float and Truck" area only and not anywhere else on the grounds. Please refer to the Float/Truck Parking Application form on the website for more information.

17. During winter months arena lights can be used. They must be turned off before you leave the Club. Switches for these are located on the outside wall of the Pavilion between the male and female toilets. The other switch is located on the far side of Arena 2 on the light pole nearest the side arena gate. Arena lights must be switched off at 8.30 pm to comply with Council Regulations.
