PAPATOETOE PONY CLUB

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Welcome to **Papatoetoe Pony Club (PPC).** Our wonderful Club was founded in 1949 and has become a popular and respected club. In November 2006, we moved from Papatoetoe to our current grounds in Brookby. These grounds are home to both the Pony Club and Papatoetoe Adult Riding Club (PARC).

Situated on a picturesque 105 acres in the heart of Brookby, this premiere Club offers many facilities including:

- 1x Ebb & Flow Surface Arena W/ Dressage Mirrors
- 1x Sand & Shell Mix Surface Arena
- 1x Dressage Arena
- 1x Lunging Ring
- Cross Country course with jumps ranging from first start (50cm) to A1 or 3*
- Covered pens (with storage lockers for the grazers)
- A large modern Pavilion with toilet and kitchen facilities
- The old clubrooms with kitchen and toilet facilities as well as block-out blinds and movie projection equipment
- Beautiful grazing paddocks (these are for our grazers as well as our club owned sheep and cattle)
- A lengthy bridle trail including bridges and creek crossings

PPC provides fantastic riding facilities and rallies for its members and holds many great and memorable events throughout the year attracting riders throughout Auckland and beyond.



RALLIES

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We run our rallies throughout the season on a mix of Wednesdays and Saturdays. We are lucky to have an awesome selection of great coaches who rotate throughout the season. You can expect to have a rotation of between 3 and 5 coaches throughout the season. Grazing members are required to attend a minimum of 60% of rallies. If you can't ride, you're welcome to attend unmounted, or ask if you have another way you would like to be involved. For our competitions and representative teams there are some attendance requirements which are outlined further on.

NO SHOW FEE - There is a \$20 fee payable if a rider signs up for rally and does not attend or for cancellations within the last 24 hours before rally with no vet or medical certificate.


Wednesday Rally - 5.00pm Start Time unless discipline specific (Split 4:30pm then 5:30pm start)

Saturday Rally - 10am Start Time

This season we have a wide range of rallies, competitions, training competitions, goal setting sessions, guest speakers and a camp on our calendar.

IN-HOUSE COMPETITIONS

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We have numerous in-house competitions each season. These competitions have trophies associated with them which are awarded at the end of season prize-giving. For these competitions riders are split by age group and there are trophies for each category and age group.

To be eligible for these trophies there is a minimum rally attendance requirement:

D, D+, C-5 Working Rallies (3 of which must be on the nominated horse.)

C+ - 4 Working Rallies (2 of which must be on the nominated horse.)

 ${f B}$ and ${f Up}$ - 2 Working Rallies (1 of which must be on the nominated horse.)

CERTIFICATES

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We aim to run two exam sessions per season where eligible riders are invited to sit their certificates. To be eligible to sit for certificates, riders must have a minimum of three signatures against each curriculum criteria in their record of learning card. One of the signatures must be in the 'ready to be examined' column, some riders may get more than 2 signatures in the record of learning column.

Leading up to exams there will be additional horse management and riding sessions to prepare riders, including a mock exam day.

There is a small cost for sitting exams depending on the level of certificate. C+ certificate and above riders are also required to sit a pre-exam assessment 4 weeks prior to the exam. This is done during a rally.

To be eligible to sit certificates riders must meet these attendance requirements.

D, D+, C - 5 Working

REPRESENTATIVE EVENTS - CLUB - - - - X

Teams have two or three training sessions with the selected coach and the coach also travels with the team/s for the competitions. ARENA BOOKINGS

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You can have lessons from any instructor in any of the arenas on the grounds. If you want to have exclusive use of a space so you're not interrupted by other riders, the arena closest to the pavilion has three spaces. Arena 1 is the 60x20 dressage space, and 2A and 2B are half each of the main space. The link to the booking system is on the pony club website. The cost for booking is \$5 per 45 minutes. Payment to be made to the PPC bank account prior (ref: name, arena, date). Bookings cannot be made within two hours of start time.

ARENA RULES

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Booking required if you would like exclusive space.

Please be considerate when booking arenas, especially in winter when they are in high demand and the rest of the grounds are closed.

If you want to cancel your booking, please do so as early as possible.

Please pick up all droppings in any arena or road.

Approved and tagged helmets to be worn at all times.

No lunging in any arena, except for the round lunging pen.



GATE TAGS

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All new members will be charged a refundable bond of \$35 for their gate tag. Lost or extra tags will be charged at \$35 each. Refund of bond on return of tag. Gate tags remain the property of Papatoetoe Pony Club. If you would like an additional gate tag please contact membership@papatoetoeponyclub.co.nz

GUEST PASSES

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Members can bring nonmembers onto the club grounds using our guest pass system. This has a cost of \$30 per guest, the form on the website under membership> Guest Pass, must be completed prior to the visit. Members are responsible for their guest/s and must accompany them at all times while they are on the grounds.

HEALTH AND SAFETY (ACCIDENTS)

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Horse-riding is a sport which has risks, and we try to minimize these wherever we can. We want to make sure that everyone on our grounds is safe. If you have an accident, or see something unsafe, it's up to you to report it. We have an online form on the club website for this.

If you have a fall, please don't be offended if you are asked to undertake a simple concussion test before you can remount. If there is any doubt about the safety of you continuing to ride, you'll be asked to stop riding.

KITCHEN - RALLIES - - - - X

At the Wednesday and Saturday rallies the kitchen will typically be open selling drinks and hot food. Each family will be rostered to do rally set up and rally kitchen duty.

The food will generally be heat-and-eat. This season kitchen helpers will not need to select a menu nor purchase the food themselves, but rather heat and serve the food.

Kitchen and rally set up is separate from working bee hours.



GRAZING

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Grazing places are available on application for pony club and adult ride members.

We have available:

Herd Grazing \$145 per month (Mares & Gelding herds)

Segregated grazing \$70/week

Float parking \$35 per month (Available to all members)

Truck parking \$45 per month (Available to all members)

WORKING BEE HOURS AND HOW THEY ARE RUN

The season is from 31st August 2022- 1st September 2023. The required number of hours per season is 18 hours per family and/or 18 hours for each rider 18 and over. Cost for not completing hours is \$1,000 and this is invoiced at the end of the season to families who have not completed their full hour requirement. PPC is a busy club and we run a large number of events, so we need our members to support us with this. PPC Competitions and organised working bees for maintenance around the club count towards your hours.

If you act as a first aider for a rally you can also count this as 1.5 hours

RULES

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Papatoetoe Pony Club shall abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Papatoetoe Pony Club Constitution.

Grazers on Club grounds shall abide by the conditions of the Grazing Rules and the Grazing Agreement.

Approved helmets with a red (transition to yellow) tag are to be worn whilst riding at all times on Pony Club grounds.

Bad language, excessive use of a whip or spurs will not be tolerated and will be dealt with immediately by the most senior person present at the time or referred to a committee member.

You must not exceed the speed limit of 15km per hour when driving down the driveway or anywhere around the Club.

There is no lunging in arenas 1, 2 or 3. Lunging is only permitted in the lunging arena. Jumps are not permitted in the lunging arena.

When jumping there must be one other person present. When jumping cross-country, you must wear an approved back protector.

All droppings must be picked up from the arenas, covered pens, driveways and outside yards and transferred to the designated manure pile (located at the back of the covered pens).

Hay is not to be fed in the covered pens. Please use the outside grass pens if you need to feed hay.

The covered pens must be swept after use to remove all debris and feed and when necessary washed if the horse has urinated to eliminate smells and reduce flies in the area.

Boots with heels must be worn in stirrups.

Horses must not be ridden in head collars/halters - bridles only.

All dogs must be on a lead at all times and under control.

Horses must not be left unattended in the concrete pen area for long periods of time. On competition days horses must be put into the outside grass yards so they are not standing on the concrete yards for long periods of time.

Horses under four years' old, unbroken horses and stallions are not permitted on the grounds.
